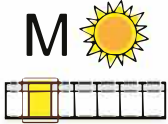
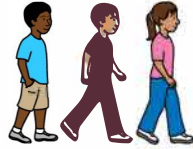


Anzac Service

Some people will talk on the microphone.



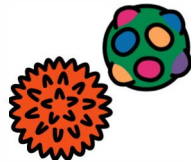
Some people will be singing on the stage.



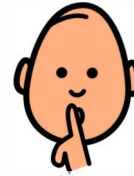
There will be trumpet music playing sometime during the ceremony.

Someone on the stage will tell everyone when this will happen.

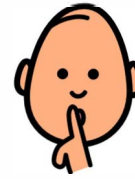
Anzac Service

The trumpets will stop after some time and everything will go quiet.



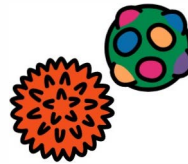
Everyone will be quiet at the ceremony when this happens.

If I feel uncomfortable or fidgety I can use my fidgets.

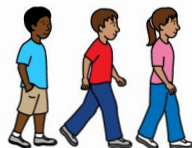


The ANZAC service is not for very long.
