COMPASS NOT CONNECT

We have streamlined the number of platforms we use for school administration. **We will no longer be using Connect for parent communication or QKR for parent payments.** All communication will be via Compass's News Feed. A handy guide for using Compass is [here](#).

If you do not have a Compass login, or can't access it, please see the friendly team at the front office.

Compass is now used:

- As a platform to communicate all important information from the Principal and also classroom teachers (News feed). It is essential that all parents and carers check Compass regularly, and we recommend that you turn on notifications to receive alerts for new posts.
- To publish students' Semester 1 and 2 formal reports, and other formal reports (eg NAPLAN, On Entry, PAT, Phonics Screen).
- For parents to monitor their child's attendance and enter an explanation for absence or lateness
- To show a child's timetable and the school calendar.
- For parents to consent to some school events, such as excursions and incursions.
- To pay for School Contributions (also available through the school booklist service and at the front office via EFTPOS or direct debit).
- For parents to view documented plans / IEPs for identified students.
- For parents to view information about their child attending the sick bay.

RUNNING CLUB (Kindy – Year 6, before school)

All Kindergarten to year 6 students are invited to attend Running Club on the school oval on Tuesdays in terms 2 and 3, between 7:45 and 8:15 a.m. Students will earn a faction point for each lap completed and may also aim to join our “100 club” if they run 100 laps, “200 club” if they run 200 laps or even “300 club” if they run 300 laps over the two terms.

Teachers will provide students with their QR code to count their laps on Monday. Students are encouraged to keep this in their school bag.

We have two iPads per faction to scan student bar codes each lap. Students must go to the correct iPad, or their laps won't be recorded.

- K-2 students have a bright **orange** QR lap card (and the K-2 lap scanner will be wearing an **orange** volunteer vest).
- Year 3-6 students have a white QR lap code and will be scanned by someone NOT in an orange vest.

We need 8 volunteers each week to help with the barcode scanning. Volunteers are required between 7:40 am and 8:20 am each Tuesday.

READING AWARD CEREMONIES

All students should record home reading in their Reading Logs at least 4 times each week. Before bringing their Reading Logs to school to be checked by their teacher each Monday, they are responsible for updating the total number of days they have recorded this year.

Home reading milestones are recognised at either a classroom or school level throughout the year.

- 10 days – 1 Gold token from the class teacher
- 50 days – 5 Gold tokens from the class teacher
- 100 days – a Certificate of Achievement from the principal (and 10 Gold tokens)
- 150 days – a Certificate of Excellence from the principal (and 15 Gold tokens)
- 200 days – a Remarkable Reader pin from the principal
- 300 days – a Remarkable Reader badge from the principal

INTERSCHOOL WINTER CARNIVAL (YEAR 5 AND 6 STUDENTS)

Year 5 and 6 students have had the opportunity to try out and train for the Interschool Winter carnival that will be held on **Monday, 23 June**. Selected students will then compete against the other schools in the VSSA network in a round-robin style competition. The sports played at the Winter Carnival are AFL, Soccer, Netball and League Tag Rugby.

FACTION CROSS COUNTRY CARNIVAL (YEAR 1 – YEAR 6 STUDENTS)

On **Friday, 26 June**, all Year 1 to 6 students compete in their year levels/gender to run their cross-country race around the school, earning points for their faction. The students run the following distances:

- Years 1 and 2: 780m
- Year 3: 1km
- Year 4: 1.4km
- Year 5 and 6: 1.8km

The top 10 students from each race receive a certificate, and the top 2 students receive a Champion and Runner Up medal at the presentations. The top-placed runners in years 3 to 6 will be selected for our Interschool Cross Country team in term 3.

Students in the maths extension programs will be able to be selected in our interschool teams in the [Have Sum Fun online](#) competition. A team of four students in years 3, 4, 5, and 6 will compete in this competition. The term 2 competition runs from **1 to 19 June**.
