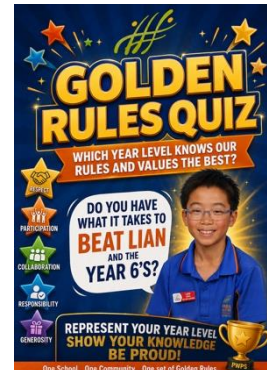

Kindergarten, Pre-Primary and Year 7 enrolments for 2027 close on the first Friday of term 3 (24 July).

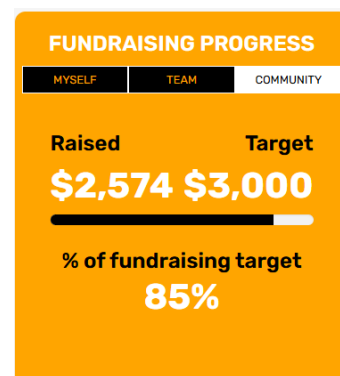

Students who live within the school's local intake area (or those with siblings currently enrolled at PWPS in the 2026 PWPS local intake area, but the new local intake area of Aspiri or Piara Waters West PS in 2027) are guaranteed a place, but you still need to re-enrol.
- Current Pre-Primary to Year 5 students do not need to re-enrol for 2027 unless moving schools.
