

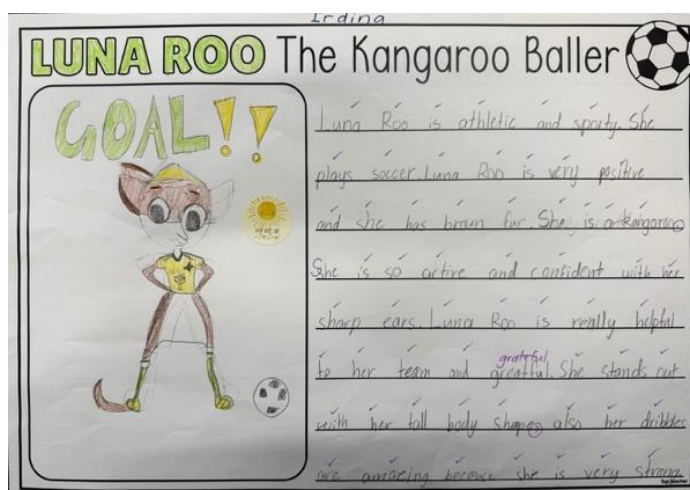
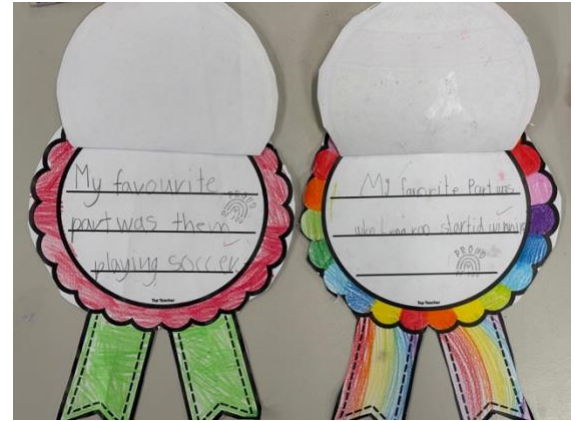
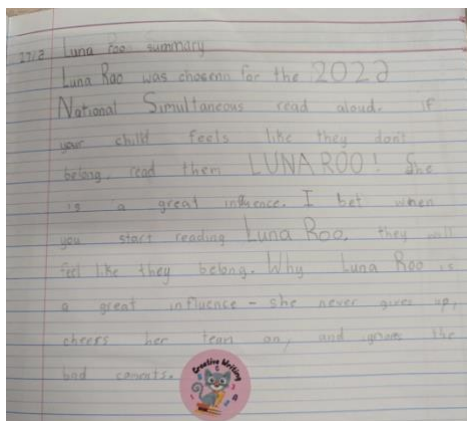
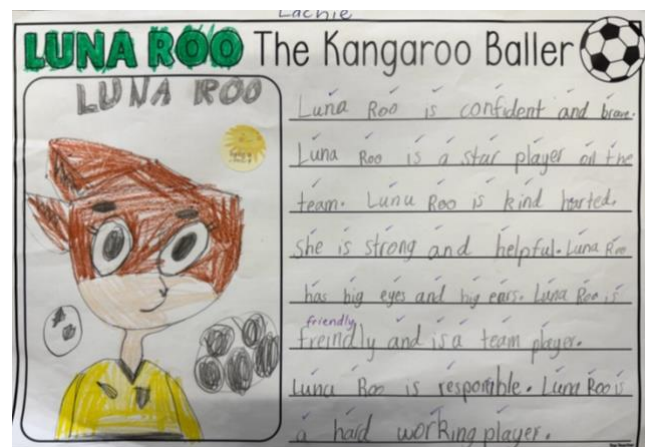
TERM 2 WEEK 7 UPDATE
