

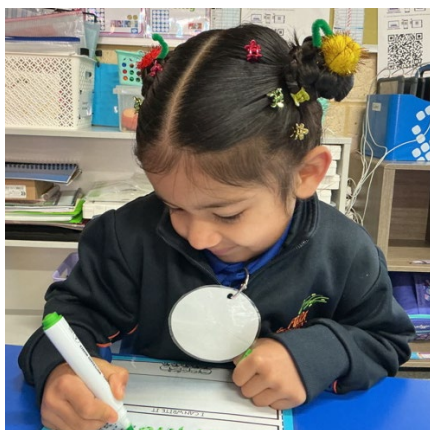
TERM 3, WEEK 3 UPDATE

YEAR 1 - 4 SWIMMING LESSONS

All **Year 1 to 4 students** will have access to in-term swimming lessons later this term. Permission and swimming enrolment forms will be sent home on **Monday**.



The forms for Year 1 swimming, (**Monday 1 September – Friday 12 September** at State Swim, Canning Vale) will be due back on Monday, 25 August 2025. Year 1 students will have 9 swimming lessons due to the Staff Development Day occurring on Friday, 5 September.

The forms for Year 2, 3, 4 swimming, (**Monday 15 September – Friday 26 September** at Cockburn Arc) will be due back on Monday, 1 September 2025.

The cost of lessons will be between \$55 and \$65. This includes entry into the pool each day and the bus trip to and from school. Payment will be due by the end of term 3.
